

This book approaches history with counter factual analysis, exploring really more than 10 events and outcomes. It is an important contribution to any library of that tragedy known commonly as the Civil War. The author starts with his interpretation of what happened (for instance Sumter). He then reasonably proceeds to what might have happened. And often, provocatively, he adds a what if the

"what if" had happened. The war study truly becomes intriguing, dare I say fun. It is history, therefore, the reader can take issue with any phase of the analysis/interpretation. But the active learning involved in this book will cement firmly the contents of the work. Too, every reader, examining his own previous studies of the conflict, will add to the list of questions. 'Tis an inevitable bonus for sure. There is one thing I offer as a suggestion to e-book producers, perhaps e-book authors also; find a standard for "notes" which allows one to go the note and return to the read seamlessly. Some books do, some books don't. Anything that speeds the read, probably increases sales of one of technology's finest gifts, the e-book. That said, purchase this intriguing book, a fascinating learning experience.
