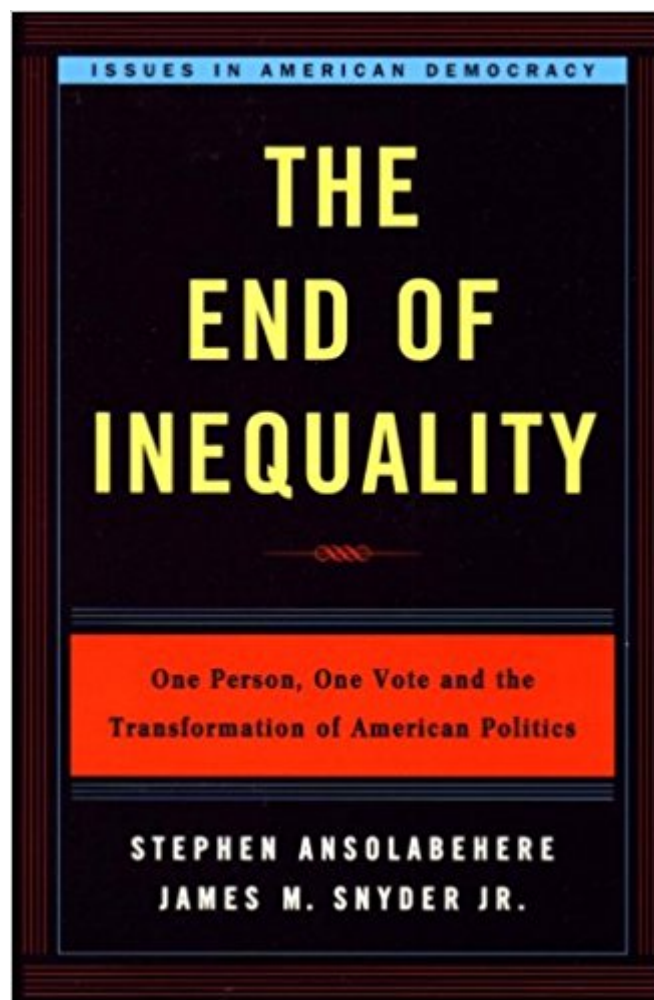


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The End Of Inequality: One Person, One Vote And The Transformation Of American Politics (Issues In American Democracy)
